A: Replace cat /etc/issue with cat /etc/debian_version Q: Installing from source not working due to PHP version conflicts I am trying to install Zend Framework from source, and it's not working due to version conflicts. I am running Debian 5.0.6 (lenny). My php version is 5.3.0 and my Zend Framework version is 1.12.3. I am trying to install using these commands: ./configure make make install But it's giving me the following error message: ERROR: '/usr/lib/php5/20131226' does not exist! ERROR: In order to run the build, these paths must be created. ERROR: /usr/lib/php5/20131226 ERROR: /usr/lib/php5/20131226/php_imagefilter.so ERROR: /usr/lib/php5/20131226/php_pdo_sqlite.so /usr/lib/php5/20131226/pdo_sqlite.so seems to be the culprit, and I can't seem to change it because it's part of a zend package. Any help would be greatly appreciated. The problem is that you are building from source on a debian-based distro, such as ubuntu. You must configure and make the build according to the debian's rules. Read the README file included in the source directory and follow the steps. Working on an exhibition with a two-year deadline can be hard.
